ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PROGRAM

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students enrolled in the Bangor Adult Education High School Diploma Program, beginning in September 2010, will be required to have earned twenty (20) credits, of which four (4) must be English, three (3) in Math, three (3) in Science, one (1) in United States History, and one (1) additional social studies.

Credits from high school previously attended are transferable with the exception of physical education and health.

Credits may also be awarded for out-of-school experience, as outlined in the State of Maine Adult Education Administration Policy Handbook.

Upon satisfactory completion of the graduation requirements, the student will receive a Bangor Adult & Community Education Diploma signed by the Adult Education Director. Diplomas are issued during the graduation ceremony, or by special arrangement after the graduation date.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to attend the Adult High School Diploma Program a student must be 17 years of age or older. Exceptions to this rule may be made if there are extraordinary circumstances and upon the approval of the Superintendent of Schools.

Students that are enrolled in high school must be 17 years of age or older and in the 12th grade to enroll in High School Diploma classes.
