

1. Bids were requested to improve drainage around the playground area at the Bangor Regional Program. The lower part of the playground retains water and is a real issue in the winter months, impacting the ability of the students to use the playground.

2. Bids were requested to pave the walkway from the main building and the portables at the Bangor Regional Program. The walkway is quite muddy at times and difficult to clear of snow.

- Proposals were obtained to replace doors at the Fairmount, Doughty, Downeast, and Mary Snow schools. All doors being replaced are beyond repair due to damage caused by the elements and frequent use.

Lack of bidders is somewhat concerning but the bid by Aaron Newcomb is within the estimated cost provided by Carpenter Associates.

- Prices were obtained to replace the steam traps at the Fairmount, Fruit Street, Vine Street and James F. Doughty schools. There are 400 known traps to be replaced and many are leaking, while others have failed. Should additional traps be found, they will be priced individually. Improperly working traps compromise the efficiency of the heating system.
